



# United States Navy Biography

## CAPT Timothy R. Griffin, SC, USN

Captain Timothy R. Griffin is a native of Missouri and was commissioned via Officer Candidate School in 1997. He earned a Bachelor of Science in Agriculture (cum laude) from Southeast Missouri State University and a Master of Business Administration (with distinction) from the Naval Postgraduate School. He also completed Executive Education at Duke University Fuqua School of Business, Washington University in St. Louis Olin School of Business, and Georgetown University Government Affairs Institute.



His assignments at sea include disbursing officer and wardroom officer, USS John F. Kennedy (CV 67) during Operation Southern Watch; supply officer, USS Hopper (DDG 70) during Operation Enduring Freedom; assistant supply officer, USS George Washington (CVN 73) during Operation Tomodachi; and supply officer, USS Dwight D. Eisenhower (IKE) (CVN 69) during Operation Inherent Resolve. All of his teams have deployed globally earning multiple Supply Blue "E" awards for logistics excellence and multiple service excellence awards, but he is most proud of his IKE team earning the inaugural Commander, U.S. Naval Air Forces, Jackie G. Brown logistics excellence award and their first Captain Edward F. Ney memorial award for food service excellence.

His assignments ashore include integrated logistics support intern, Naval Supply Systems Command (NAVSUP); assistant supply officer, Naval Air Station Oceana; executive assistant to the assistant commander for contracts, deputy department head for contracting policy and process management, and procuring contracting officer, Naval Air Systems Command; naval aviation enterprise site director and director of naval aircraft engine programs, NAVSUP Weapon Systems Support Philadelphia; division chief for capabilities, innovation, joint concepts and wargames, U.S. Transportation Command; and director of operations and plans, Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) Troop Support. Captain Griffin completed his major command assignment as commanding officer of NAVSUP Fleet Logistics Center Bahrain, prior to his current assignment as director of the subsistence supply chain at DLA Troop Support.

Griffin is a qualified Naval Aviation Supply Corps officer and Surface Warfare Supply Corps officer. He has achieved Defense Acquisition Workforce Improvement Act Level III certification in Contracting, Level III certification in Life Cycle Logistics, Level II certification in Program Management, and he is a member of the Defense Acquisition Corps. He is also a graduate of the Naval War College Command and Staff Program. While assigned to the Naval Postgraduate School he was awarded the Naval Supply Systems Command Award for Academic Excellence in Management. His awards include the Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (two awards), Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (four awards), Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (four awards), Sea Service Deployment Ribbon (five awards), and various unit awards.
